If you would like to submit an article for consideration in the Open Forum section of the journal, please contact the Open Forum Editors, <u>Dr Deborah Madden</u> (Lancaster University, UK) and <u>Dr Ana Vera</u> (University College Dublin, Ireland). If you would like to submit a review, please contact the Reviews Editors, <u>Dr Maite Usoz de la Fuente</u> (University of Leicester, UK) and <u>Dr Mariana Liz</u> (Universidade de Lisboa, Portugal).
- **Special Issues**: Special Issues usually consist of 4-6 articles preceded by an Editorial/ Introduction. Prospective Guest Editors should contact the IJIS Editors (emails below) with a proposal, explaining the rationale for the issue, and a list of intended contributors.
- Language: The journal accepts submissions in English.
- **Formatting**: Please ensure all articles are formatted according to the <u>Intellect Style</u> Guide.
- Formats: We are open to innovative formats and approaches in your submissions.
